

Waveyard got thumbs-up across all Mesa districts

Waveyard rode a tsunami of voter approval from every corner of Mesa in Tuesday's election.

New figures from the city clerk's office show that none of Mesa's six council districts opposed selling Riverview Golf Course and four ballfields to developers who want to build a water-themed mega-resort.

The closest vote was in District 4, which covers downtown and neighborhoods south of there. Even there, voters went for Waveyard by a 60-40 percent margin.

Support was strongest in District 1, which will be Waveyard's home if its financing comes together.

Nearly half of all the total yes votes came from east-side districts 5 and 6.

District by district, here's the breakdown, based on unofficial election results as of Thursday afternoon:

District 1 - 5,554 yes, 2,543 no; 69 percent in favor.

District 2 - 4,236 yes, 2,234 no; 63 percent in favor.

District 3 - 3,081 yes, 1,775 no; 63 percent in favor.

District 4 - 1,544 yes, 1,019 no; 60 percent in favor.

District 5 - 6,913 yes, 3,285 no; 68 percent in favor.

District 6 - 6,394 yes, 3,836 no; 63 percent in favor.
